Conference Sessions

Conference welcome and plenary

UCAS reform – the future of university admissions

Join Kim Eccleston, Head of Strategy and Reform, UCAS and Carolyn Mindos, Admissions Reform Lead from UCAS for updates on the application process and Admissions Reform.

The University Admissions landscape is undergoing extensive changes, fuelled by a range of socio-economic and political factors. This session will offer insights into the latest initiatives, challenges, and best practices relating to university admissions.

Kim and Carolyn will talk about the new personal statement format and the next phase of engagement of Admissions Reform alongside key operational updates and tips to support your students.

Preparing your students for interview success

With the right preparation, students can approach university interviews with confidence and turn what might be a daunting experience into an enjoyable one.

This session will focus on panel and MMI interviews, in-person and online. Our Admissions team will share their advice on preparing your students for admissions interviews. They will offer top tips on preparing your students before, during and after the interview and how you can help your students build their confidence and get ready for their interviews.

Degree Apprenticeships – how they work and why your students could be tailor-made for it

Join our Degree Apprenticeships team to get an overview of how Degree Apprenticeships work including the application process, course places, and what the Degree Apprenticeships landscape looks like in the next few years.

You will also hear about how we work with employers to develop the programmes and support apprenticeship students plus how you can support students in making applications.

Our activities have been phased to align with the national Key Stages and provide you with a ready-made tool to support your curriculum, while contributing to the Gatsby benchmarks.

The workshops and programmes provide support and guidance for students in Years 11, 12 and 13, while campus visits provide an opportunity to explore our thriving university. In addition, we provide extensive and targeted support for younger students from under-represented backgrounds from Year 7 upwards. All our activities are available at no cost to your school/college or your students.

We also offer CPD sessions designed to support school staff completely free of charge and can be delivered online or in-person (where possible). These are delivered through our Advancing Access partnership on the following topics: Writing effective UCAS references, Supporting students to make choices at age 16/18, Preparing students for interviews and admissions tests and Understanding contextual admissions policies.

In addition to working with our existing schools and colleges, we are keen to establish new relationships with schools and colleges across London and in key regional areas.
